Dear Mr. Loeffler:

Thank you for your recent correspondence regarding LCRA TSC's proposed transmission projects.

Transmission service providers, such as LCRA TSC, are required to obtain a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) prior to construction of a transmission line.

As required by state law, the Commission considers various factors when evaluating the CCN application, such as the community, historical, aesthetic values, and environmental integrity associated with the transmission line. Commission rules also include other factors for consideration, such as whether the proposed routes utilize or parallel existing compatible right-of-ways, property lines or other features, and whether the routes conform to the policy of prudent avoidance. While it is not a requirement that proposed lines follow these factors, they are taken into consideration when deciding on a route.

Currently, the Commission is reviewing the CCN application for the Gillespie to Newton 345-KV transmission line. LCRA TSC has not formally filed a CCN application for the McCamey D to Kendall to Gillespie 345-KV transmission line with the Commission.

Nonetheless, a copy of your correspondence has been filed in Docket Nos. 37049 and 37448, so that all parties are aware of the resolution adopted by the Board of the Fredericksburg Convention and Visitors Bureau.
